

The first five years of life can be considered as one of the most critical times for building the foundations for life-long learning, well-being, and health.

What children learn in their first few years of life and how they learn it can have long-lasting effects on their success and health as children, teens, and adults

A high quality childhood learning experience is important for development to ease the transition into primary school as language and cognitive abilities are well developed.

Early childhood education programs are most effective when they are play-based and developmentally appropriate.

By engaging them in quality early education, set your child up for success by allowing them to have a strong sense of identity, connect with and contribute to their world, achieve a strong sense of wellbeing, be confident and involved learners and become effective communicators.

From the ages of three to five, most children want to play with others their age, and can think about the feelings of others at an initial level.

At this age, children learn how to play with others, and might have a 'best friend'.




By spending time with their peers, children learn to include ideas from others in their play and start to understand each other's feelings.



# Nurturing a child's curiosity



## Caring world

WIDGEE State School is a Prep-Year 6 multi age, three classroom model in a rural setting.

The 55 students at their small school focus on the core learning areas of literacy and numeracy from the Australian Curriculum.

# Smoothing the big transition

THE move between primary and secondary school happens alongside the transition from childhood to adulthood.

With this comes many changes – changes to bodies, emotions, behaviours and attitudes.

Teachers and staff understand these changes and can provide information and support.

Friendships developed during secondary school can provide peer support and help children develop social skills and self-esteem.

Making new friends and feeling comfortable are especially important when children start secondary school.

It is important to remember, however, that your child friendships may change as they develop a sense of themselves and make sense of the world around them.

A child's relationship with their parents and family may similarly change.

Students adapt to transition in different ways.

If you feel that your child is having difficulties, it is important to discuss your concerns and ask for help if needed.

Parents have an important role in supporting their children's progress at school.

It is also important to know that there are staff with specific roles to support student well-being and student learning available in schools.

Health and fitness is all about making healthy lifestyle choices, such as walking or cycling (instead of using the family car) to help reach the target of at least 30 minutes of exercise a day, only eating takeaway food occasionally, getting a good night's sleep, which for teenagers can be up to 10 hours a night, restricting computer, TV and video games to a maximum of two hours, and encouraging your child not to do these activities in their bedroom and eating a variety of fresh and healthy food every day, aiming for five serves of vegetables and two serves of fruit a day.

Cigarettes, alcohol and drugs must play no role in the life of a 12-year-old.



**Parents are the key to making the transition from Primary to Secondary school easier on their kids.**

As parents we have a responsibility to ensure that our children understand that.

We also need to model responsible behaviours ourselves.

While it is the responsibility of your child's school to support a healthy lifestyle, at the end of the day it is you as parents who need to take the ultimate responsibility for the behaviour of your child.

Many children start secondary school expecting to make new friends.

At the same time, they are concerned that they may lose contact with their current friends, particularly if they're changing schools.

For some children, the desire to stay with their group of friends influences where they would prefer to go to secondary school – and if they move to a different school they wonder how they will keep in touch and sustain their friendships.

Friends help each other make the transition from primary to secondary school easier.

Friends are people that your child can talk to, share things with, confide in and sometimes argue with.

Remember, conflict is a normal part of growing up.

Conflict is not necessarily bullying, even though it may be upsetting and need resolution.

Parents and friends play different roles in the life of children.

You influence your child's long term decisions to do with values and morals.

Your child's friends are more likely to influence short term choices, such as the way they dress and their interests.

Strong relationships with you and your child's friends help your child grow into a well adjusted adult with strong social skills.

Right now, your child's friendships will tend to be based on sharing similar interests, acceptance and sharing.

Same-sex friendships are the norm during the first years of secondary school.

# New beginnings at any age

LOCALS tell how UniSC Gympie has changed their lives.

Bindi Horvath dropped out of school after Year 10, had her first child at 18 and worked a series of jobs from hairdresser to legal secretary to cleaner.

"In 2019, I enrolled at the University of the Sunshine Coast's Gympie campus and started a Bachelor of Nursing Science mid-year. I'd always loved writing and had nursing in the back of my mind but didn't think I was smart enough. I was a high achiever through school but expected a university degree – to be beyond my capabilities. I chose Gympie 99 percent because it was the closest campus and 1 percent because I loved how small it was; I didn't feel like I would get lost in a sea of faces and random names. In 2022 I gained employment at Gympie Hospital as an Undergraduate Student in Nursing (USIN). I now work as a graduate nurse at its Acute Services



Unit, where I did placements."

For Gympie's Rachel Astill, starting university with her then teenage daughter made all the difference. After all, not many people decide to tackle their first degree in their early 50's.

"I thought, 'I'm too old for this. I can't do this'. So it took a bit of persuasion to overcome the self-doubt but I surprised myself," said Rachel, who is about to begin a career as a qualified counsellor after many years raising a family and

working in hospitality.

Rachel was 51 years old when she was convinced to take the first step towards a new way of life and join her daughter in enrolling in UniSC's free Tertiary Preparation Pathway (TPP) at its Gympie campus in July 2019. Rachel believes a university degree would have remained out of reach had TPP not been offered at the local Gympie campus.

"I'd never written an essay in my life prior to starting TPP so that was a big challenge to overcome. ... It was comforting to walk into the first class and see a mixture of ages and realise that university is not just for school leavers."

"I proved that it is never too late to get out of your comfort zone, back yourself and try something new. The biggest change has been my confidence in my abilities. I discovered that I really am capable."
